

Symptoms of Chronic Mercury Poisoning

CENTRAL NERVOUS SYSTEM

- irritability
- anxiety/nervousness, often with difficulty in breathing
- restlessness
- exaggerated response to stimulation
- fearfulness
- emotional instability
 - lack of self control
 - fits of anger, with violent, irrational behavior
- loss of self confidence
- indecision
- shyness or timidity, being easily embarrassed
- loss of memory
- inability to concentrate
- lethargy/drowsiness
- insomnia
- mental depression, despondency
- withdrawal
- suicidal tendencies
- manic depression
- numbness and tingling of hands, feet, fingers, toes, or lips
- muscle weakness progressing to paralysis
- ataxia
- tremors/trembling of hands, feet, lips, eyelids or tongue
- incoordination
- myoneural transmission failure resembling Myasthenia Gravis
